
What's Happening at Hearthstone

The OTW and Black History

Currently the History Museum at the Castle is exhibiting A Stone of Hope: Black Experiences in the Fox Cities, a pop-up exhibit about the history of Blacks in Appleton and the surrounding area. The exhibit won an award from the American Association of State and Local History in 2015. This newsletter has published ongoing articles about African Americans in the Old Third Ward.

Rebecca Hollensworth

Sarah Emma Cleggett, "Mrs. Hollensworth," (OTW Summer, 2015 newsletter) was married to Albert Hollensworth and had two daughters: Gertrude Louise Hollensworth (Fall, 2014 newsletter) and Rebecca (Alberta) Hollensworth.

Alberta Hollensworth was born in Neenah on February 22, 1885. Her father Albert, for whom she was named, did not live with the family for long. By the time Mrs. Hollensworth and her two daughters moved from Neenah to Appleton to live with her parents, Alberta was known as Rebecca. This was likely a tribute to her grandmother, Rebecca Cleggett.

It appears Rebecca was a sickly girl. The elder of the two daughters, she attended Ryan High School in Appleton along with her sister but didn't graduate until she was 22 years old in 1907. From there her health further declined, and she succumbed to tuberculosis on July 23, 1909. Her obituary published that day in the Appleton Post states: "For several years past she suffered with tuberculosis..." and that she'd spent several months at the State Tuberculosis

Sanitarium at Wales, Wis., returning to her family 2 weeks before her death after "...all efforts were in vain..."

Rebecca had already suffered terrible personal losses: her father left when she was young, and her mother and sister died within a few months of each other only 3 years before. She was survived by her grandparents and two aunts.

The write-up of her death is appropriately touching, given her young age:

"...[she] bore her ills with patience and was courageous to the last. Uncomplaining and cheerful she endeared herself to her family, whose sorrow is very deep over her loss."
